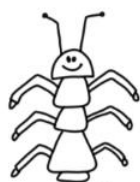
Week 3: Our Great Outdoors

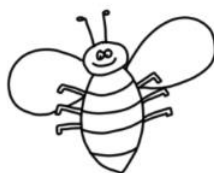
Either in your garden or outside, go on a mini beast hunt and see if you can find all the insects from the chart below. Tick off the insects you find and have a think about what the habitat they live in is like (is it dark, bright, damp, dry etc). The most important part of this task is to remember not to disturb the mini beast's habitats. If you move something such as a leaf or stone to try and find one of our mini beasts, make sure to put it back exactly as you found it so the insect can carry on living there.

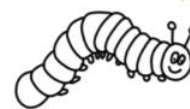
Bee

Note to parents:
