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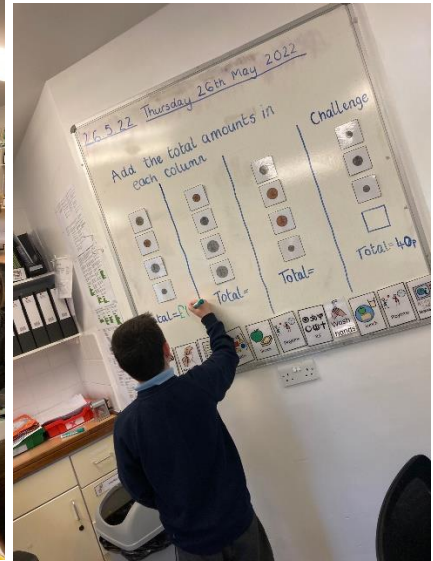

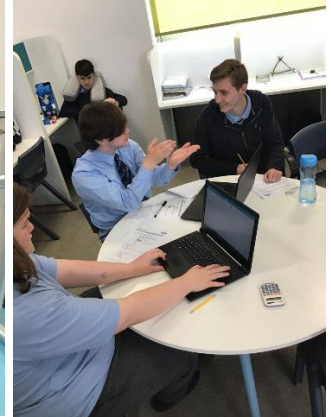

As always, a key focus, particularly for our older students is on preparation for adulthood, and with that in mind our Supported Interns have continued to thrive in their placements. For those considering the Supported Internship route a visit to Liverpool Women's Hospital provided an opportunity for our students to see how many different career routes were on offer all in one place. Key Stage 4 and 5 students have enjoyed visits to local colleges and in order to get them ready for the potential move, many have engaged with (and passed!) their travel training course. Of course – thinking about the future starts young for many students and our Key Stage 3 students enjoyed an Apprenticeship Talk from Jake Croxton this term. We continue to be proud of all of our students for engaging well with thinking about their future.

Our older students have also continued to take on roles that provide much inspiration for our school community. A cohort of our students are training to be “mentors in violence”, our buddies continue to support our lower school and one of our Head Students represented views at a “Violence against women” event at the Cunard Building, Liverpool where their views were taken to help support women across Liverpool who experience violence.

Across the school we have enjoyed the relaxing of COVID restrictions and have been able to return to more off-site visits. These include local trips (such as Calderstones Park or Strawberry Fields) and trips which are further away – with our furthest destination this year about to be visited – Germany!
