Sadly, our school does not appear to feature in any of the proposals and so, I would like to ask for your support to raise this as a problem. We are heavily oversubscribed, with little, if any options remaining to create more capacity on our site. Teacher: Miss Hattersley


In Ireland Class this week we have been singing and practising for our assembly that we are very excited to perform for our friends and family.


Key Stage 2

Portugal Class Teacher: Miss Gibney	Portugal Class have been working very hard in their phonics lessons all week. Portugal Class continued reading Hodgeheg in English and answered some questions about chapter 3 both verbally and in written format. Portugal Class continued learning about the topic of length and height in maths. In their French lesson, pupils continued learning how to say different animals in French and they were very confident in doing so. They also made a Victoria sponge cake in Food Technology which they really enjoyed making and eating!
France Class Teacher: Miss Last	France Class have had a busy week. In Maths, we continued working on the topic of measuring. We have been measuring different objects around the classroom and then decided which apparatus was best to measure them such as rulers, meter sticks, tape measures and a Trundle wheel. In English, the students made their own fact files about hedgehogs. Our topic this term in Science is Everyday Materials. This week we looked at a range of different materials and decided which materials we could change the shape of by squashing and twisting, and which materials we could not change. In Art, we looked at work by the artist Andy Goldsworthy and created our own masterpieces using patterns. We also worked together in Food Technology to bake a delicious Victoria Sponge Cake. Well Done France Class on a super week.
Spain Class Teacher: Miss Ledward	Spain Class have had a lovely week. We have continued to explore the story 'Aliens in Underpants Save the World' in English and designed our own alien and explored different adjectives to describe them. In Maths, we have started our new topic of addition and subtraction and have focused solely on number bonds - some students have even looked at adding 3-digit numbers to a 1-digit number! We made a yummy sponge cake in Food Technology, in PE we developed our understanding and skills on how to sprint and in History investigated what castles the Normans built in the UK. It has been a fantastic week and Spain Class have worked so hard! Well done Spain Class!
Italy Class Teacher: Mrs Cooney	Italy class came back to school full of energy after their bank holiday weekend! We explored the Muslim celebration of Eid and read wonderful stories of kindness and helping others. We built mosques with blocks and made shapes and patterns in our sensory trays. In Food Technology, we made a delicious Victoria sponge cake. The children loved cracking the eggs and mixing all of the ingredients together. The best part was the taste test! In English, we started our new book 'Alien's Love Underpants'. We recorded all of the things that are important to us that we would take to space. We even made rockets with junk modelling. May the Fourth (Star Wars Day!) was a big hit with Italy Class. We did lightsaber phonics and worked on our pencil control skills on Star Wars maps. In Maths, we have looked at ordering numbers correctly and using our knowledge of place value to move the spaceships to the correct parking space! Have wonderful weekend Italy Class!

In Maths we have continued our work on area and in English we started to read <i>The Twits</i> by Roald Dahl. We have explored forces and magnets in Science, carrying out a fun experiment that involved toy cars, bubble wrap and a ramp. In Life Skills we discussed why it is important to care and how we can show people we care for them. We hope you all have a great and restful weekend and we look forward to another week filled with great learning activities, next week!
USA Class Teacher: Mrs Suku	This week USA have been preparing their assembly to host in front of their key stage and families. They have been so confident and put so much effort into their speech. We have also been concentrating on Chinese art and English persuasive writing techniques.
Brazil Class Teacher: Mrs Rodway	Brazil Class have worked hard this week. We have been finishing off our work on fractions in Maths and continuing our story <i>Charlie and The Chocolate Factory</i> in English. During PE we completed an obstacle course in athletics and used our bodies to move and change direction. This week, even though it has been a short week, has shown how amazing Cape Verde are in producing some amazing work.
Seychelles Class Teacher: Miss Joyce	This week in Seychelles, the class completed the following activities: In English, we have finished reading, 'The Great Kapok Tree' and have answered comprehension questions about what happened in the book. Australia Class Teacher: Mr Lyons	This week in Australia Class, we have been working diligently to prepare for our Maths and English exams. In PE we have been completing strength circuits to improve our overall performance for athletics, and in Food Technology we have made Chinese sweet glazed pork.
Samoa Class Teacher: Miss Gibney	It has been another amazing week for Samoa Class! In English we have been practicing fronted adverbials in past, present and future tense. We have been focusing on our grammar and punctuation in preparation for our upcoming exams. In Maths, the class have focused on money, we have been learning how to calculate the interest of a total amount and using this in word problems. In PE, our special visitors LFC had some very fun basketball activities for the class to complete, ending in a game of basketball so the class could show off their skills. In Science we focused on static electricity, and we had a hair raising experience completing the balloon and hair experiment! The class have continued to enjoy their various accredited learning classes, practicing their basketball skills, designing posters of inspirational black people for a Liverpool wide competition and exploring World War 1 in History. In Food Technology we made slow glazed pork - how yummy does that sound?! We also finished our class book "Blood Brothers" with rave reviews, and we attended the library to explore all of the books on offer throughout the school. We are continuing to work extremely hard for our exams later this month.
New Zealand Class Teacher: Mr Spillane	This week in New Zealand Class, we have been working on some spelling, punctuation and grammar rules in English to prepare us for our mock exams coming up. We have also been looking at money and budgeting in Maths. For Science we have looked at forces and we will be finishing the week off by creating a whole class art exhibition.
