My work this week was purely strategic, with the focus on:

- Admissions for 2022-23
- SEND Inspection of the local area (now finished, with the findings to follow)
- LCC SEND Sufficiency Strategy – the closing date was initially 11 May 2022 but we learnt yesterday that it has now been extended by a fortnight until 25 May 2022.

On that note, I repeat my plea: anyone wishing to support Abbot's Lea School and its future is encouraged to contact Lorraine Walters at lorraine.walters@liverpool.gov.uk to ask for the Council to review its SEND Sufficiency proposals and offer a solution to the over-subscription of student numbers at ALS. We would like to see investment into our school, as well as others in need, and we believe that our students' complex needs deserve a state-of-the-art learning environment.

Anyone can voice their opinion through this informal consultation and we know that the demand for specialist school places is high, rising and that Abbot's Lea School is very well-placed to offer support to children and young people age 3-19 with Autism and associated support needs. We just need more space and better spaces to do so.

Portugal Class Teacher: Miss Gibney	Portugal Class have had a fantastic week. In Food Technology we made chocolate twists which everybody really enjoyed making and eating! In French we learnt how to count from 0 to 10 and in PE we joined France Class and completed a range of different athletics activities (e.g. throwing, jumping etc). In History we continued learning about The Battle of Hastings and what the different parts of the castle are called. In Life Skills we will be learning about what foods are safe and unsafe to eat, what can happen and who to tell if you eat an unsafe food.
France Class Teacher: Miss Last	What a fun busy week France Class have had! This week we started our swimming lessons, which the students have all enjoyed. In our French lessons, we learnt colours and classroom objects and put these new words into sentences. In Science we continued our topic of Everyday Materials. We looked at metal and plastic and discussed why they are used. In Art we looked at examples of clay sculptures by the artist Andy Goldsworthy. We then designed and made our own clay sculptures. We have also made some delicious cakes in Food Technology, working together to carefully follow a recipe.
Spain Class Teacher: Miss Ledward	Spain Class have had a wonderful week! We explored what it would be like in space in our English lessons through lots of sensory activities and some students made their own 'space suits' and told us what they would take with them to space. In Maths, we have been developing and practicing our number bonds. In History, we looked at features of castles and in Food Technology we made chocolate twists which were very yummy! We also celebrated Mental Health Awareness Week by having an afternoon 'spa day' where students enjoyed foot spas, face and hand massages and treats! They really enjoyed it and have worked very hard this week! Well done Spain Class, have a great weekend!
Italy Class Teacher: Mrs Cooney	Italy class have loved all of our activities this week linked to Mental Health Awareness Week. We have been on sensory nature walks around our forest areas. The children have engaged in lots of mindfulness strategies including meditation, relaxation techniques and messy sensory trays. On Thursday, we even had our very own spa afternoon with soothing smells, foot massages, fruit snacks and relaxing sounds. In Food Technology this week, we made chocolate twist pastries. 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

Key Stage 3

Mozambique Class Teacher: Mr Hodgson	A great week for Mozambique Class that has had a Chinese theme this week. We have been learning about Shang Kings in History and exploring traditional Chinese artwork, with some fantastic art work produced by students! Elsewhere we have started our new reading text in English - The Hobbit!
Madagascar Class Teacher: Miss Jennings	This week in Madagascar Class we have had another great week of learning. We have been exploring magnets and understanding how they work in Science. We have been recognising and adding different amounts of money together. We have continued to read The Twits and have learnt when and how to use direct speech. In Art we have used a step by step guide to draw our own Chinese dragons. We had a great session with our MVP mentors all about racism, where we engaged in lots of great and meaningful discussions. In Life Skills we discussed types of unkind behaviour and created story boards from different scenarios that involved unkind behaviours and how we could help. We created our own animations using pivot in Computing and have been working hard all week practicing our spellings and timetables. We hope you all have a restful and enjoyable weekend ready for another great week.
USA Class Teacher: Mrs Suku	This week USA have really impressed staff with their animated e-books during their Computing lesson! We have all enjoyed cooking yummy potatoes in Food Technology and testing the force and strength of magnets!
Brazil Class Teacher: Mrs Rodway	Brazil Class have had a lovely week. We carried on reading our book Charlie and The Chocolate Factory in English and we used dictionaries to find the meaning of words from the book. In Maths we finished off the topic of time. We used clocks to make the time and recognised timings throughout the day. We completed some work on forces and magnets in Science and looked at Chinese art in our Art lessons. Well done Brazil Class for another great week! Keep up the good work.
Kenya Class Teacher: Miss McClintock	This week in Kenya Class we have finished reading the story of The Twits. We discussed the ending and if we felt it was a good or bad ending. In Maths, we continued to look at area and perimeter, with some of us comparing regular and irregular shapes' perimeter, whilst others have been finding the area of triangles and parallelograms. We had a great information session with Be More, who came into school and discussed different apprenticeship options we may like to investigate in the future. In Science we used newton meters to test the force required to pull a toy car along a number of different surfaces along with the importance of assuring a fair test. In Art we looked at Chinese blossom trees and made our own lanterns inspired by the Chinese blossom trees. In History we learnt about the tomb of Fu Hoo and research what it might have looked it.
Cape Verde Class Teacher: Mr Hatton	This week in Cape Verde we have continued building our knowledge on the Shang Dynasty. We have focused on burial sites in History. We have also continued looking at Shapes and Symmetry in maths. Students can now find lines of symmetry and sort shapes into correct orders. In English we have continued with our persuasive letters to logging companies so that they can reduce the number of forests we are destroying. In Life Skills, we have been focusing on puberty. We discussed the changes that happen to our bodies and

	how we can support them emotionally. Cape Verde have worked super hard and the class team are so proud of them as always. Enjoy your weekend!
Seychelles Class Teacher: Miss Joyce	This week in Seychelles, the class have completed the following activities: In Maths, we have continued to look at the measurements of different shapes. In English we have looked at persuasive techniques and created our own examples. In Science, as it is Mental Health Awareness Week, the students looked at the ways in which we can have a conversation about our mental health. And finally, our class are looking after eight chickens and so far three have hatched! We have named them Jose, Juan and Clucks (two boys and one girl). As always, well done Seychelles for all your hard work!
Botswana Class Teacher: Miss Caveney	This week in Botswana Class we investigated different kinds of forces. We investigated what was and was not magnetic around the school and we held an experiment to test how different surfaces have different amounts of friction. We also wrote letters persuading people in WW2 to take action and do their part to help evacuees. We are very impressed with the students writing skills. We have also spent time painting some of our Warhammer figures, and the students are very excited to play with the figures once they're painted.



Key Stage 4

Australia Class Teacher: Mr Lyons	This week we have had a Science Week focusing on several units in preparation for submitting coursework. In PE we have completed several strength circuits to condition ourselves for athletic season and in Food Technology we made delicious samosas!
Samoa Class Teacher: Miss Gibney	This week in Samoa we have been focusing on exam practice, because practice makes perfect! In English we have been going over the correct use of punctuation and grammar, and applying this knowledge to creative writing tasks. We have also began our new class book, Skellig by David Almond. In Maths we have been solidifying all information learnt this year, such as time, shapes, measurements, square numbers and more! In ICT we have been working on following instructions to create word documents, and identifying areas the students struggle with so we can improve on this before the exams. In PE, LFC have been working hard to teach the students the basic skills of basketball. The students have been completing fun drills and enjoying playing games of basketball with their class mates. In Science we have been looking at the formula distance = speed x time, and have used this to calculate real world problems. In RE we have discussed terrorism and different religions views on terrorism, discussing that both the Christian and Islamic religions reject violence. With all of this hard work we have taken some time to de-stress and used our sensory facilities throughout the school, including various sensory rooms and walks around the forest school. We have also been working hard in our accredited learning groups to get our qualifications in various subjects such as Design Technology, History, Food Technology, PE and Art! We also want to shout out two of our students, Githan and Lily, for taking part in the school-wide buddy scheme, where they have provided support and participated in activities with classes in the lower school, well done! We also want to say a big Happy Birthday to our class teacher Miss Gibney, we appreciate all you do for Samoa!
New Zealand Class Teacher: Mr Spillane	A great week for New Zealand Class. We have been looking at budgeting in our Maths lessons and how to manage money. In English we are continuing to practice our punctuation skills and grammar. In Life Skills we are continuing with our project which is based on 'Our City - Liverpool, My Home'. The students are also getting used to our Accredited Learning lessons that we have in the afternoon. A big well done to the KS4 students who competed in the football tournament last Saturday too! Have a lovely weekend everyone!
Papua New Guinea Class Teacher: Mrs Wong	PNG had a fabulous week! In English, we learned about organisational features of different types of text including letters, emails, web pages, leaflets and adverts. We recapped on singular and plural verbs and the relevant spelling rules. We practised 10 minute tests in preparation for our mock exams. In Maths, we practised percentages and ratio, working out percentage increase and decrease word problems. In Science, we practised forces in action and worked on completing our science booklet. In Life Skills, we discussed the topic of rights and responsibility. We gained a better understanding that for every right comes with responsibilities. We discussed the difference between prejudice and discrimination. We have been challenging ourselves every morning in solving Wordle, Globle, Worldle and Heardle together. We also practised judo, learned a throw and how to back fall safely.





Liverpool Reverse Jobs Fair
