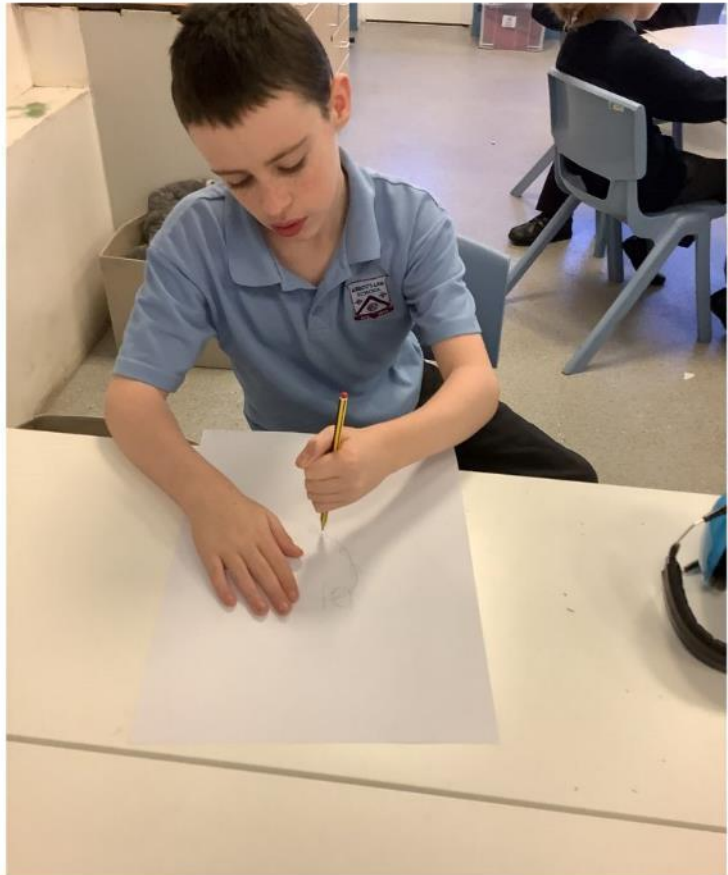
This week in preparation for Christmas, the students decorated baubles. They were given lots of different arts and craft materials and encouraged to be as creative as possible.

Key Stage 4

Australia class

Australia class have had yet another fantastic week!

As a class we have visited three colleges including Hugh Baird, Knowsley Community and Greenbank College. The students received a tour of each campus and were given the opportunity to ask any questions they may have about their potential future at college.

In terms of lessons, the students have been working hard, as always, in order to enhance their skills and ability in each subject. The class have worked on using the SQI method in English, using a number line to order positive and negative integers in Math's and explored the structure and functions of the nervous system in Science.

In Food Tech, the students continued their focus of creating quick foods by following a framework to make Veggie Snacks. The students took turns to wash and cut the vegetables before dipping the veggies in a hummus dip.

The several students that partake in work experience at the Quirky Quarter had a very exciting week this week as they were able to assist with a huge booking in which approximately 100 people visited the attraction. Our students assisted the visitors by giving them a guided tour around the facility and taking pictures for the customers. A great day was had by all involved!

New Zealand class

This week in New Zealand class, we have made big progress in our fractions journey. We have also concluded our work on the skeletal system and a short recap on the circulatory system in science. We will now be moving onto the nervous system.

Samoa class

We have had such a busy week in Samoa class!

The students have visited a number of colleges including; Hugh Baird, Greenbank, Myerscough and Knowsley college - this gave the students the opportunity to see what the different colleges had to offer and what the facilities on campus were like. These college visits give the students the opportunity to explore all options available to them when they finish year 11.

All of the Samoa students showed a lot of maturity during these trips and were a credit to Abbot's Lea School - Well Done Everyone!

Class News

Tasmania class

Tasmania class had started visiting colleges this week. On Monday we visited Hugh Baird College and on Thursday we visited the Greenbank College. We walked round the college looking at their facilities and some students were able to ask questions about the courses they might be interested in applying in the future.

In English, we practised on applying basic English grammar skills correctly in writing. We focused on verb tenses and sentence structure.

In Maths we learned and practised on prime and composite number. Students are now able to use mathematical terms such as odd, even, factor, multiple, prime and composite when describing numbers and their properties.

In Science we reviewed on the different types of blood vessel and how their structures help them carry out their jobs effectively. We then moved on to our next topic - nervous system. We looked at the basic differences between the central nervous system and the peripheral nervous system.

In ICT we reviewed on using formulae in Excel spreadsheet. We also learned how to create a graph based on the data presented in a table and sort the data using the filter function.

In Food tech we used cucumber, pepper, celery, yogurt, hummus and chives to make some veggie snacks. We recapped on how we can use our knives safely using the claw and bridge method.

In PE we learned more about rugby tackles and practised with our partners.

We also made some Christmas craft for our Christmas party.

In maths this week, the class have looked at probability, this included worded probability and numbered probability. When finding the numbered probability, students had to use their knowledge of converting fractions, decimals and percentages.

This week in English, students have continued to read our class book survivor. We have also looked at effective usage of punctuation, finding examples in the book. In food technology this week we made ham and cheese rolls.

We have continued to plan for the Christmas party too, which the class are really excited for. Overall, this week has been great for Malawi class, well done everyone and we hope that everyone who is ill gets better soon!!

In Maths we have been looking at time analogue and digital. Science we have started to look at the structure of the atom and the periodic table. We also got a visit from Jonny the elf on the shelf doing various things in our class.

Christmas Island class

In maths lessons this week Christmas Islands class learnt how to accurately draw a line graph. They ensured to include important aspects such as a title, key, measurements and ensured to label both the X and Y axis.

In our ICT lesson Christmas Islands class explored excel, entering in data and using the auto sum function. They worked to solve any problems that may arise. In English the class practiced their speaking and listening skills by using scenario cards to discuss whether they would agree or disagree and why to different social file and e.g. would you let someone log into your bank account or would you drive over the legal alcohol limit after a party.

In employability Christmas Islands class focused on their planning of the Christmas party, where they created posters to advertise the party around the school. They made different posters appropriate to key stages across the school and ensured to include necessary information such as the location, time, date and what would be offered at the party.

In Science Christmas Islands class focused on isotopes, they gave a definition for an isotope and looked at the make-up of a carbon atom, exploring how many protons and neutrons it has. In PSHE students worked on posters for the Christmas Party. Students had to include factual information like location, time and date, decorative elements like borders, formatting and pictures, and use an engaging style of writing. Students also had to adapt their poster for their assigned key stage by using appropriate language and images for age of audience. Students received feedback on their posters and made changes to address this feedback. In food tech students made Cornish pasties.

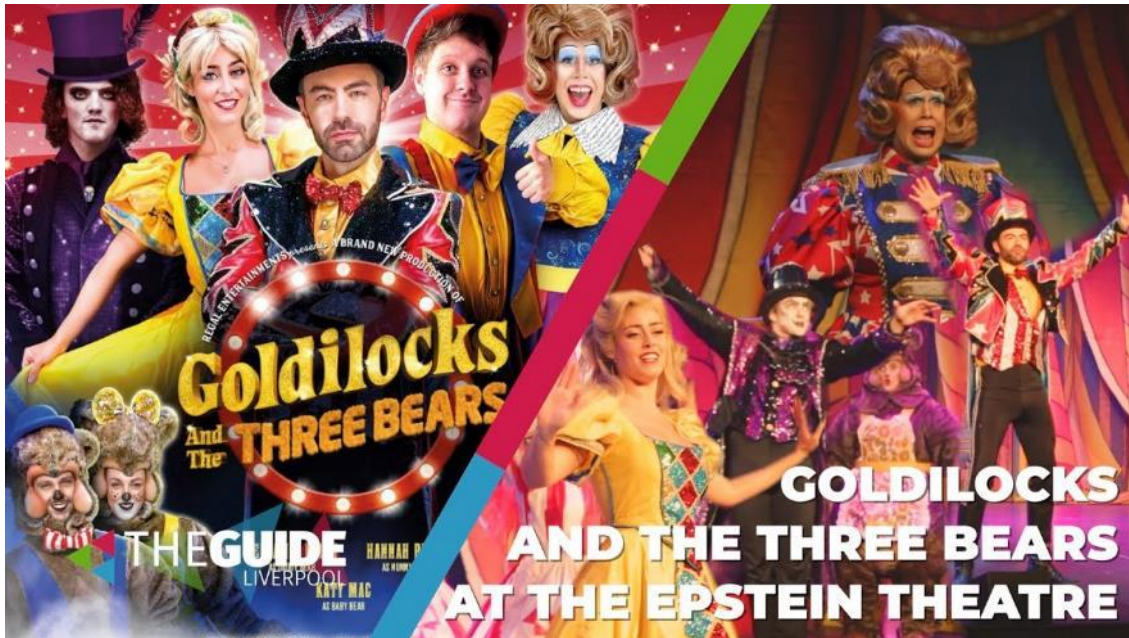
