Dear Students, Families, Colleagues and Friends

Welcome to today's newsletter. Did you know that this week marks a half-way point in the school year? Time flies, doesn't it?!

We had another busy week here at ALS, with the key event being a three-day National Autistic Society Accreditation visit. I want to thank all staff, students and families for their engagement in this process and share with you some interim feedback received from the inspectors.

The external specialists were highly praising of the staff' professional practice and our students' response to all teaching and support interventions. The same team were here three years ago and they said that the positive changes to the school are evident everywhere!

They were impressed with the high quality of teaching across the school, and seemed in awe of the strength of staff' knowledge of the students, their interests and support needs. Relationships were evidently a strength, too and the assessors referred to this in both "staff-student" sense and when sensing the general "atmosphere" in the school.

They were amazed at how the school has progressed its holistic provision agenda over the past 3 years (since the last accreditation visit) and recognised that this is especially commendable in light of the Covid pandemic which has resulted in many schools pausing their innovations and development.

They have praised the fact that we have not and that all of the developments are palpable in a joint working between the various experts in the school.

Most crucially, they saw clear evidence of our students thriving. They spoke to the students, sought their views and their families' experiences and concluded that the students are and feel safe here and that they are benefiting greatly from the specialist support we offer them.

Superb examples of communication, sensory support, positive behaviour support, assessment processes (initial and ongoing), staff CPD opportunities, family support and liaison, as well as students' and families' voice and views were scrutinised, showcasing the best of Abbot's Lea!







### School Swimming 2023 (EYFS/KS1 - KS4)



EYFS/KS1 - KS4 Students will be having swimming lessons as a part of the Physical Educational Curriculum this academic year. Swimming sessions will take place between January and June 2023, with all classes assigned specific weeks.

A school minibus will take the children to Halewood Leisure centre during the morning sessions of their assigned weeks. The sessions are led by trained swimming instructors and are supported by the class team.

### Consultation on a proposal to establish Bank View South as a satellite for

### Bank View High School at the former Parklands site

**Dear Families** 

Mrs Hildrey has requested that all families are made aware of the consultation on the following proposals by Liverpool City Council:

- 2. As this is a public consultation, Mrs Hildrey would be keen for Abbot's Lea School's students' families to support her in voicing general support for the creation of more spaces for students with complex needs in the city, but raising concerns that the proposals do not address the pressures Abbot's Lea School has been under over the years.

Abbot's Lea School is oversubscribed by approximately 40% and, as such, urgently requires prioritisation of capital investment. Families are kindly asked to promote building of a new school campus with all learning, therapy, sporting and leisure facilities for our large and growing complex population, or addition of new facilities to the existing site.

The consultation is being carried out in accordance with section 19 (1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 and the closing date for responses is 5pm on 15 February 2023.
