Attendance and punctuality

There is clear evidence that strong attendance at school links to strong educational outcomes for students. If your child's attendance is below 90%, we will expect to work closely to understand your family context and work with you on providing the support you need to help your child improve their attendance.

We appreciate that for many of you, punctuality is not within your control, as you rely on SEN transport providers to bring your child to and from school.

However, where you are in control of the journey to school, we do expect a punctual arrival.

Despite a heavy flow of traffic, all students have been consistently in lessons by 9.15am each morning unless their transport has arrived late.

In the same way as we monitor attendance, we now also monitor punctuality and will be inviting the families of those students who are <u>regularly</u> late to explain their situation to us so that we can support improved compliance with a punctual arrival to school.

Assemblies

Assemblies are facilitated by Mrs Tobin (Deputy Headteacher), Miss Gibney (Assistant Headteacher – Primary Department) and Mr Mason (Assistant Headteacher – Secondary Department).

However, each week a different person or class will lead the assembly. When your child's class leads the assembly, their teacher will contact you in advance to let you know.

We work with high expectations that by the end of the year, all students will be able to sit through a whole assembly and listen well. However, we recognise that this skill, like any, needs to be taught. In order to do so, we will follow a graduated approach to full attendance in assembly for our younger students.

We warmly welcome families to attend assemblies (with coffee morning on the same day). However, if your child leaves assembly before the end, you are invited to leave with your child and enjoy a "stay and play" session with your child in their classroom (or other designated area.) Where the weather permits, we will be making great use of our fantastic grounds. Any students who leave assembly will do so with their class and remain in their class group with any family members.

I share with you below our gradual approach to full attendance in assembly.
